Right behind UMHB in the standings in Hardin-Simmons, which is also ranked in the national polls. The Cowboys hit the road to face Texas Lutheran. Both teams have won three straight games. -OFFENSIVE-

Justin Feaster, QB, Jr., Hardin-Simmons

Hardin-Simmons junior quarterback **Justin Feaster** (*Glen Rose, TX / GRHS*) was responsible for five touchdowns for the second time this season, passing for three scores and running for two more to lead a 55-10 win over Sul Ross State. Feaster, who takes the league's top weekly honor for the third time this season, was 14 of 20 passing and ran for a team-high 54 yards on seven carries. His TD scampers were from 19 and 21 yards out.

-CO-DEFENSIVE-

Anquanius Frazier, CB, Sr., East Texas Baptist

East Texas Baptist senior cornerback **Anquanius Frazier** (*Daingerfield, TX / DHS*) had two interceptions – both in ETBU territory and the last one coming in the fourth quarter at the 5-yard line with the Tigers clinging to a three-point lead against Mississippi College. Frazier, who became the only player in the ASC this season to record multiple interception games, helped the Tigers to a 24-21 road win. He added two tackles and a pass break-up.

Stephen Jackson, DE/LB, Jr., Louisiana College

Louisiana College junior end/linebacker **Stephen Jackson** (*Haynesville, LA / HHS*) tied an American Southwest Conference record with 4.0 sacks – totaling a loss of 65 yards – and had nine tackles to spearhead a unit that allowed zero net rushing yards in a 39-7 home win over Howard Payne. Jackson also added a forced fumble and two hurries. Four of his tackles also went for a loss of 65 yards.

-CSPECIAL TEAMS-

ZaVious Robbins, KR, Jr., Hardin-Simmons

Hardin-Simmons junior kick returner **ZaVious Robbins** (*Mesquite, TX / MHS*) tied an American Southwest Conference record by taking back the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown in a 55-10 win over Sul Ross State. Robbins, who also caught two passes for 53 yards and a score and rushed for 11 yards, tied the league record set by Mary Hardin-Baylor's Aertrail Robinson earlier this season.

Texas Lutheran RB **Ralph Valdez** ran for a season-high 55 yards and scored the Bulldogs' first TD of the day in a win over McMurry. . . . Mississippi College RB **Desmond Mays** had 61 rushing yards and 83 receiving yards in a loss to ETBU. . . . Sul Ross State RB **Jermaine Swearington** ran for 100 yards on 19 carries in a loss to HSU.

DEFENSE: Texas Lutheran DE **John Jackson** made five tackles, 1.5 sacks and one fumble recovery to pace a unit that held McMurry to just 26 yards of total offense. . . . Hardin-Simmons S **Matt Warnasch** made 13 tackles to lead a win over Sul Ross State. . . . Mary Hardin-Baylor FS **Derrick Williams** had nine tackles and broke a school record with a 47-yard fumble return for a touchdown in a loss to NAIA Southern Oregon. . . . Howard Payne S **B.K. What to Know: Mary Hardin-Baylor has won 26 straight ASC games. . . . East Texas Baptist is just one of three league teams to have beaten UMHB since the 2000 season (also Hardin-Simmons and Howard Payne), doing so with a 28-21 overtime win in 2003. The Tigers earned the league's automatic berth into the NCAA playoffs that season. . . . UMHB LB Ben Beckworth leads the ASC with 9.5 tackles for loss. . . . ETBU DE Austin Sturrock (5.0) and Anquanius Frazier (four) are tied for the league lead in sacks and interceptions, respectively.

All-Time Series: Mary Hardin-Baylor leads, 7-1

Last Meeting: UMHB 72, ETBU 7 (11/03/07, in Belton, TX)

– *Mary Hardin-Baylor started slowly, but exploded and rolled to a 72-7 victory over East Texas Baptist. UMHB clinched the ASC championship with the win. UMHB rolled up 417 yards rushing and 643 yards of total offense. The Cru held ETBU to just seven yards rushing and 190 yards of total offense while forcing six turnovers. What to Know: Sul Ross State is 3-1 at home this season, with its only loss at Jackson Field coming in overtime. . . . MCMURRY

McMurry's offense only generated 26 yards of total offense as Texas Lutheran shutout McMurry 18-0 on Saturday at Wilford Moore Stadium. The bright spot for McMurry was their defensive effort, which forced four turnovers and held TLU to only 243 yards of total offense. McMurry defensive back Daniel Griggs had arguably his best performance of his McMurry career as he picked off two passes and returned them a combined total of 82 yards. David Boyd also picked off a pass for McMurry and returned it 39 yards, while Joe Alexander scooped up a fumble for McMurry and returned it 16 yards. McMurry's defensive unit accounted for 137 yards off of returns.

SUL ROSS STATE

The 13th-ranked Cowboys (AFCA poll) racked up 545 yards of total offense against the Lobos while holding Sully to 330. Hardin-Simmons utilized its high-octane passing unit and tallied 339 yards through the air with the freshman-laden Lobos mustering 108. Sul Ross had the edge in the rushing game out running the Cowboys, 222 to 206. Jermaine Swearington ran for 100 yards off of 19 carries while quarterback Monte Morales clocked 9 of 19 pass attempts for 102 yards. Freshman receiver Kellen Gierke posted 3 receptions for 33 yards in the effort. Johnnie Williams and Devin Hudson led defenders with seven tackles each.

EAST TEXAS BAPTIST

ETBU has rushed for over 200 yards in each of their four wins this season. The Tigers haven't reached 200 yards on the ground in any of their three losses.

HOWARD PAYNE

The Yellow Jackets suffered a 7-39 loss to Louisiana College. In the game the Jackets did not move into the positive side in rushing till late in the second half, due mainly to 7 LC sacks totaling 107 yards. Freshman free-safety B.K. Medlock recorded 9 tackles, 1 INT, and 4 pass breakups in the loss.

TEXAS LUTHERAN

The Texas Lutheran Bulldogs held McMurry to 26 yards of total offense and forced five turnovers in an 18-0 shutout win...TLU won its third consecutive game and moved to 4-3 overall and to 3-2 in the ASC...The shutout for TLU was its first since a 45-0 defeat of Austin College on Sept. 2, 2006 in Seguin...TLU set a new school record for fewest passing yards by an opponent, holding McMurry to 21 yards through the air. McMurry completed 4-of-16 passes and threw three interceptions. The old TLU record for fewest passing yards by an opponent was set in 1974 against Trinity. The Bulldogs held the Tigers to 25 passing yards in a 37-0 victory...TLU held McMurry without a third-down conversion (0-for-13) and limited McMurry to 46 total offensive plays. McMurry rushed 30 times for five yards...The Bulldogs recorded eight tackles for loss, resulting in 43 yards in losses. The Bulldogs also picked up five sacks (for 40 yards), recovered two fumbles, tallied 84 interception return yards and broke up four passes...Sophomore linebacker Jack Moses collected 1.5 sacks and two tackles for loss (for 13 yards)...Junior defensive end John Jackson also tallied 1.5 sacks and 1.5 tackles for loss (for nine yards). Jackson also recovered a fumble...The other two TLU sacks went to freshman defensive ends Justin Rose and Matt Crabtree...TLU interceptions went to sophomore linebacker Jarrad McAdams, senior safety Dwight Bonner, and freshman safety Mark Alvarado. For Bonner, the pick was the 14th of his career and his second in 2008...For Alvarado, his interception was his second in as many games. After returning an INT 75 yards for a score against Sul Ross State on Oct. 11, Alvarado picked off a Taylor Penn pass in the third quarter and returned it 36 yards down to the McMurry 22. The Bulldogs were not sharp on offense vs. McMurry. TLU committed four turnovers (three interceptions and a fumble) against McMurry. TLU entered Saturday's game with only six turnovers committed in its first six games of 2008. (TLU was tied for the league-lead for fewest turnovers)...TLU returns to Seguin's Matador Stadium next Saturday for its 2008 Homecoming contest, hosting No. 12-ranked Hardin-Simmons.

MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE

The Choctaws are 2-5 but have played one of the toughest schedules in the nation. Three of their losses have come against #5 Millsaps, #8 UMHB and #12 Hardin-Simmons. They also have a loss to NAIA #11 Cumberlands...The Choctaws are the only team in the nation to have played four opponents, NCAA DIII or NAIA, ranked in the Top 12 in the nation...Junior linebacker Quartez Ashmore has moved up the ASC tackle leaders list now ranking 5th in the league with 58 total stops in seven games. Ashmore had eight stops in the loss to East Texas Baptist University and has 22 total tackles in his last two games...Senior offensive tackle Jacob Mattina continues to turn in a solid season. Mattina has consistently graded out highest among MC offensive linemen and is positioning himself for All-ASC honors...Desmond Mays only rushed for 61 yards against ETBU, but he also turned in 83 receiving yards. Mays is 2nd in the ASC in rushing and also 2nd in all-purpose yardage averaging 128.6 per game.

ABILENE, TX - Hardin-Simmons was celebrating the 500th game of legendary head coach Jimmie Keeling and it did not take them long to give him a present as ZaVious Robbins took the opening kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown and HSU never looked back in a 55-10 win. Robbins became the all-time leader in kickoff return yardage for the Cowboys on his 100-yard return. He now has 1,043 kickoff return yards in his career. Carrillo moved to third on the Cowboy receiving yardage list with 2,967. He had six catches for 113 yards in the game. Justin Feaster was 14-for-20 for 288 yards and three touchdowns. He also ran seven times for 54 yards and two more touchdowns. HSU had 545 yards of total offense in the game. Matt Warnasch had 13 tackles and Ricky Poe had 10 to lead a defense that allowed only 330 yards.

East Texas Baptist 24 Mississippi College 21

CLINTON, MS - East Texas Baptist University scored two fourth quarter touchdowns as the Tigers rallied for a 24-21 win over the Mississippi College to spoil homecoming in Robinson-Hale Stadium. Trailing 14-10 entering the 4th quarter, the Tigers got a 46-yard touchdown run from Jair Stover and a 51-yard rushing touchdown from Trevor Cavness to take a 24-14 lead. Cavness' score came with just 2:05 remaining in the game. The Choctaws made a late comeback scoring a touchdown just 41 seconds later when Tommy Reyer found Renard Ellis from 23 yards out to pull within 24-21. The Choctaws' onside attempt with 1:24 remaining was recovered by the Tigers and ETBU ran the clock out. ETBU was led by Jair Stover, who rushed for 159 yards on 24 carries including the 46-yard touchdown run. Trevor Cavness added 88 yards on eight carries.

Texas Lutheran 18 McMurry 0

LC also posted their highest rushing output of the season, gaining 206 yards on the ground. James Gathright picked up 130 of those yards rushing. LC quarterback Derek Lewis threw for 284 yards and three TDs. LaMarcus Preston was Lewis' favorite target as he found him seven times for 113 yards and two scores. Stephen Jackson led the way for the Wildcat defense, racking up nine tackles and a single game school record of four sacks.

Southern Oregon 40 #3/3 Mary Hardin-Baylor 28

ASHLAND, OR - Mary Hardin-Baylor could not battle back from an early deficit as turnovers and crucial penalties derailed the comeback attempt in a 40-28 loss to NAIA Southern Oregon. UMHB finished with 305 yards of total offense on just 55 offensive plays. Southern Oregon rolled up 324 yards on 79 plays with 174 of those coming on the ground. Saenz finished 12-24 passing for 213 yards and a pair of TDs, but he also threw his first three interceptions of the season. Robinson caught eight passes for 88 yards and a score and Landrum finished with 60 rushing yards on 15 carries. Rosales ran for 139 yards on 35 carries and Hunsaker finished 21-32 passing for 150 yards and three scores. The Cru turned the ball over five times, only held the ball for 21:59 of the game and committed 11 penalties for 115 yards.

Hardin-Simmons, East Texas Baptist, Texas Lutheran and Louisiana College were all winners of conference games during Week 8 of the American Southwest Conference football season on Saturday (Oct. 25), while Mary Hardin-Baylor suffered its first loss of the season – a non-conference tilt on the road to NAIA Southern Oregon. Nationally-ranked Hardin-Simmons (7-1, 5-1 ASC) used a conference-record 100-yard kickoff return for a touchdown to begin the day from ZaVious Robbins and never looked back, helping head coach Jimmie Keeling celebrate his 500th career game with a 55-10 home win over Sul Ross State (3-4, 2-3 ASC). The Cowboys have now won three straight contests. East Texas Baptist got two fourth-quarter touchdowns to complete a 24-21 come-from-behind win on the road against Mississippi College (2-5, 2-3 ASC). The Tigers (4-3, 4-2 ASC) used 40-plus-yard touchdown runs from Jair Stover and Trevor Cavness to seal the victory. Texas Lutheran (4-3, 3-2 ASC) utilized a stingy defense that forced five turnovers and held McMurry (0-8, 0-6 ASC) to just 26 yards of total offense in an 18-0 road victory. It was the third straight win for the Bulldogs. Louisiana College made the best of its first home game on campus in Pineville, La., with a 39-7 win over Howard Payne (2-5, 1-4 ASC) at Wildcat Stadium. LC (4-3, 2-3 ASC) racked up 514 yards of total offense and got a conference-record-tying four sacks from Stephen Jackson. Nationally-ranked UMHB (6-1) fell behind early, turned the ball over five times and committed 11 penalties for 115 yards in a 40-28 loss to Southern Oregon. LOUISIANA COLLEGE

The Wildcats opened Wildcat Field with a 39-7 win over Howard Payne. It was LC's first on campus home game since 1968...Stephen Jackson set an LC game record with 4.0 sacks in a game, against Howard Payne. As a team, LC came 0.5 shy of a team game record of 7.5 in a game...LC senior running back, James Gathright posted the first 100-yard rushing game of his career, gaining 130 yards against HPU. Louisiana Sports Writers Association members picked this week's state college football players of the week and one of the three players honored was linebacker Stephen Jackson, who set a school single game record for Louisiana College and tied the ASC record with four sacks in a win over Howard Payne. Jackson chased the Howard Payne quarterback all over the field resulting in 67 lost yards on the four sacks. The Haynesville product also caused a fumble and helped the LC defense limit HPU to zero yards rushing and just 138 yards of total offense.

MARY HARDIN-BAYLOR

The Cru dropped from the ranks of unbeaten with a 40-28 loss at NAIA Southern Oregon. UMHB was held to just 92 yards rushing in that game. It was the first time the Cru had been held under 100 yards rushing as a team since Wisconsin-Whitewater limited UMHB to just 49 rushing yards in the 2006 regular season meeting. Josh Saenz went over the 200-yard passing mark for the second time this season and threw a pair of touchdown tosses. Aerttrail Robinson had his first career touchdown reception and Josh Landrum scored his first career rushing touchdown for the Cru. UMHB needs to win two of its final three games to clinch a fourth straight ASC title and fifth straight NCAA postseason berth.

HARDIN-SIMMONS

Jimmie Keeling coached his 500th game on Saturday and now has a career record between high school and college of 352-137-11. HSU scored touchdowns on eight of its nine possessions on Saturday. The only one they didn't was an interception that went through the receivers hands and to the defender at SRSU's 18-yard line. In the last two games, the Cowboys have touchdowns on 17 of its last 21 possessions. Two of those were knees taken at the end of each half against HPU.
