West Champion Texas Lutheran Set to Host 2008 ASC Volleyball Championship Tournament

Live Statistics Available for All Matches; Free Video Streaming for Championship

RICHARDSON, Texas — Texas Lutheran University completed a 17-1 run through league competition and earned the right to host the 2008 American Southwest Conference Volleyball Championship Tournament, to be held Nov. 7-8 at Susan Duke Court at Tostengard Activity Center in Seguin, Texas.

The entire six-team, single-elimination event will be available for fans through live statistics, while Saturday's championship game will also have free video streaming with audio for the first time in tournament's 11-year history. All links can be found on the conference's website, www.ASCsports.org.

Head coach Tiffany Davis' Bulldogs (20-7) will receive a first-round bye as the West Division champion. TLU also enters as the defending ASC champion. Hardin-Simmons University (19-11), which won the ASC crown in 2006 and reached the title game last season, wrapped up the No. 2 seed in the West. McMurry University (19-7), which won the conference title in 1997, clinched the division's third spot for the second straight year.

OFFENSIVE

Patricia Allen, MB, Jr., Texas-Dallas

Texas-Dallas junior middle blocker **Patricia Allen** (*San Antonio, TX / Judson HS*) hit .394 with 35 kills to help the Comets wrap up a share of the East Division crown with sweeps of LeTourneau East Texas Baptist and Mississippi College. Allen, who takes the division's top weekly offensive award for the third time this season, added 11 digs, five blocks, two assists and one service ace. She helped UTD hit .323 as a team.

DEFENSIVE

Krissy Seaman, LIB, Sr., Texas-Dallas

Texas-Dallas senior libero **Krissy Seaman** (*Mansfield, TX / MHS*) averaged .467 digs per set over three division sweeps that allowed the Comets to earn a share of the East title. Seaman, who takes the division's top defensive award for the second straight week, also added five service aces and five assists.

Tamika Heline, OH, Fr., Howard Payne

Howard Payne freshman outside hitter **Tamika Heline** (*Spring Branch, TX / Smithson Valley HS*) hit .373 and posted 27 kills and five service aces over seven sets to pace the Lady Jackets. Heline, who takes the division's top weekly offensive award for the second time this season, also added 30 digs, two blocks and one assist.

CO-DEFENSIVE

Sara Keithley, DS, Sr., Concordia Texas

Concordia Texas senior defensive specialist **Sara Keithley** (*Colorado Springs, CO / Doherty HS*) averaged 5.86 digs over seven sets, including 21 against nationally-ranked Southwestern, to lead the Tornados. Keithley, who takes the division's top weekly defensive honor for the third time this season, added nine assists, three service aces and two kills on the week.

Sam Lucien, LIB/DS, Jr., Hardin-Simmons

Hardin-Simmons junior libero/defensive specialist **Sam Lucien** (*Flower Mound, TX / FMHS*) had a career-best 34 digs to help the Cowgirls rally from an 0-2 deficit and hand Texas Lutheran its first conference loss of the season. Lucien, who averaged 4.18 digs over three wins, also has one service ace and one assist.

IN THE ROTATION

TEXAS LUTHERAN

The Bulldogs finished the conference regular season with a 17-1 mark, dropping the final game of the ASC season in five games at Hardin-Simmons...TLU enters the ASC Championship Tournament as the host and as the No. 1 seed from the ASC West...TLU is the defending ASC Champion...The Bulldogs have won two ASC titles (in 2004 and 2007)...TLU advanced to the national Sweet 16 in 2004...The Bulldogs fell in five games in the NCAA Tournament First Round in 2007 (losing to host Austin College)...TLU has three starters back from last season's championship squad (outside hitter Jessica Stetler, middle blocker Jamie Jahns, and middle blocker Jamie Lassiter)...Stetler and Jahns were ASC All-Tournament selections in 2007...TLU also has setter Amanda Curry, a transfer from Hardin-Simmons, that was an All-ASC Tournament selection in 2007.

HOWARD PAYNE

The Lady Jackets finished out their season with a 3-0 win over Sul Ross State. HPU finished 16-13 overall, their first winning season since 2001. Freshman Tamika Helene led the Lady Jackets with 27 kills, a .373 hitting pct., and 30 digs in the two matches. Kristin Hammond had 28 digs

TEXAS-DALLAS

UTD went 3-0 on the week as it finished regular season play. The Comets swept LeTourneau, ETBU, and Mississippi College to earn an ASC East Division Co-Championship. UTD receives a #1 seed as this marks the 3rd straight East Division Championship and 3rd straight 20 win season. Sophomore setter Niki Calverley moved up to #4 in the nation in assists per set.

MCMURRY

The McMurry volleyball team went 1-1 last week in ASC home matches as they loss to Texas Lutheran on Friday, 3-1, before rebounding on Saturday to knock off Schreiner, 3-1, in the regular-season finale. McMurry finished the regular season as the No. 3 seed in the ASC West and will take on East Texas Baptist in the first-round of the ASC volleyball championship on Friday in Seguin, Texas.

CONCORDIA TEXAS

Concordia finalized their 2008 season 9-19 overall and 5-13 in American Southwest Conference play. During their final week Concordia picked up a win against Sul Ross State University and a loss to nationally ranked Southwestern University. Seniors Juli Applewhaite and Sara Keithley led the Tornados. Keithley finished with 41 digs while Applewhaite picked up 19 kills, 21 assists and 15 digs.

The University of Texas at Dallas (22-7) and East Texas Baptist University (22-8) shared the East Division championship with identical 14-3 league records, but UTD earned the right to be the division's top seed due to a tie-breaker. The Comets will also receive a first-round bye instead of the Lady Tigers, who won three straight titles from 2001-2003. The University of Texas at Tyler (13-16) clinched its first-ever ASC tournament berth and will be the East's No. 3 seed.

Friday's matchups will be HSU against UT Tyler in the first round at noon, with the winner facing UTD in the semifinals at 5 p.m. ETBU and McMurry will square off in first-round action on the bracket's other side at 2:30 p.m., with the victor getting TLU at 7:30 p.m. The championship match is set for 2 p.m. Saturday.

Returning All-Tournament selections are TLU's sophomore outside hitter Jessica Stetler and junior middle block Jamie Jahns, HSU junior middle blocker Kaela Parnell and McMurry junior Terah Brown.

The tournament winner earns an automatic berth in the NCAA Division III Women's Volleyball Championship.

NOTES:

- Admission: \$6 for adults, \$3 for students/children, \$12 for tournament pass.
- No complimentary admission passes will be accepted.
- The ASC volleyball tournament's hosting rights rotate by division each year.
- Texas Lutheran also served as host in 2004 and 2006.
- The West Division and East Divisions are tied 5-5 for all-time ASC titles won through a tournament. There was no such event in 1996 (Howard Payne) or 1997 (McMurry).
