EAST DIVISION

Tillisha Givens, G/F, So., Louisiana College

Louisiana College sophomore guard/forward **Tillisha Givens** (*Monroe, LA / Ouachita Parish HS*) averaged 23 points on 76.2 percent shooting and 8.5 rebounds to fuel two conference wins that helped the Lady Wildcats clinch a spot in the ASC Championship Tournament. Givens, who has won the division's top weekly award four times this season, also added four steals and one assists. She went 14-for-15 from the free throw line and committed just three turnovers.

WEST DIVISION

Kassandra Bills, G, Sr., Concordia Texas

Concordia Texas senior guard **Kassandra Bills** (*Pflugerville, TX / PHS*) averaged 23 points, 9.7 rebounds and 2.3 steals over a 2-1 week against conference opponents. Bills scored 44 points – 40 in the second half and two in overtime – to help the Tornados rally to defeat Texas Lutheran in overtime. Her performance was just two points shy of the ASC's all-time record of 46 points scored in 2003 by Howard Payne's Kristy Lyons. It was also the best in the ASC this season by 11 points. Bills, who fouled out against TLU 2 minutes into overtime, was 15-for-28 from the field, 5-for-6 from 3-point range and 9-for-9 from the free throw line. She added four assists and one block on the week and missed just one free throw attempt.

HOWARD PAYNE

The Lady Jackets got two big wins this week over Hardin-Simmons and McMurry to move into a second place tie with HSU. HPU held Hardin-Simmons and McMurry to their lowest offensive totals of the season (HSU-48, McM-54). Hope Hohertz led the Lady Jackets in wins over ASC West Division leaders HSU and McMurry. Shooting .500 from the field Hohertz was 9 of 9 from the free-throw line and recorded 9 steals (4.5 per game) for the week.

TEXAS-TYLER

The UT Tyler women's basketball team went 1-1 on the week, nearly knocking off nationally ranked UT Dallas in the process. On Thursday, the Patriots led UT Dallas in the waning minutes of the game, but eventually fell to the Comets, 90-83, in overtime. On Saturday, UT Tyler bounced back nicely by beating Ozarks handily, 89-59. All but one Patriot scored on Saturday versus Ozarks. This week, UT Tyler will try to build momentum heading into the post-season by traveling to Louisiana and Mississippi.

SCHREINER

The Lady Mountaineers basketball team split for the week, defeating Concordia at home, and then losing to UMHB on the road. Thursday evening, Monica Enriquez became the all-time points leader for the Lady Mountaineers reaching the milestone of 1,500 career points. Xandria White had a good week recording 21 points, and 36 rebounds, and freshman, LaTisha Hall contributed with a solid performance as well with 12 points and 8 rebounds. The Lady Mountaineers will close out the season with home games this week against Hardin-Simmons and McMurry.

CONCORDIA TEXAS

Concordia University Texas women's basketball program had an up and down week by picking up wins over UMHB and TLU but dropping a crucial ASC game to Schreiner. Kassandra Bills had a career night against TLU after going into half-time with two points she finished the victory with 44 points, scoring 42 points in the second half of play. Concordia came back from a 20 point deficit to take the 97-95 victory over TLU. The Tornados will now host Howard Payne and Sul Ross State at home to finalize the 2008-2009 season. Concordia is one game behind UMHB going into the final week.

HARDIN-SIMMONS

HSU needs two wins to moved to 20 wins for the 11th straight year. Mollie Brawner needs five 3-pointers to move to fourth place on the all-time makes list at HSU. She has 99, including 61 this season which is third all-time at HSU. Newcombe has moved to third on the single-season rebounding charts with 303. She could get to Donna Roberts in second at 345 and would need an extended playoff run to catch Roberts record of 391. She also has the single-season blocked shots record.

MARY HARDIN-BAYLOR

The UMHB women went 2-1 and took over sole possession of fourth place in the ASC West Division. The Cru will close out the regular season with a pair of home games this week. A UMHB win and a Concordia loss on Thursday would clinch an ASC Tournament berth for the Cru women. UMHB has never advanced to four straight ASC Championship Tournaments in the program's history. Jenny Black had 14 points on 5-7 shooting in the victory over Schreiner University on Saturday.

MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE

The Lady Choctaws clinched at least the #2 seed in the ASC East with wins over LeTourneau and East Texas Baptist last week and a home victory over Louisiana College on Tuesday night. MC will host UT Tyler on Saturday in the final week of the regular season.

TEXAS-DALLAS

Every victory makes history for the Texas-Dallas Comets, who broke the 20-win barrier for the first time in program history with a pair of wins last week. UTD also assured itself of at least an East Division co-championship by improving to 17-1 in ASC play, another program first. The Comets need just one win in their final two games to clinch the division title outright. Add center Rachel Addison to the Comets' growing list of weapons. The 6-0 post had a double-double (17 points, 11 rebounds) in a win over Ozarks, then added nine more of each in the overtime win over UT-Tyler. Lauren Hale had 17 points and 9 rebounds against UTT, along with five blocked shots.

OZARKS

Ozarks has shared the scoring load among several players this season. Freshman guard Lacey Phillips is the only player averaging in double figures (11.1). Olivia Fisher and Sabrina Goddard are scoring 9.3 and 9.0 points per game, respectively. Fisher has collected 792 career rebounds, fourth-most at Ozarks. She is 12 points shy of reaching the 1,000 career point plateau.

EAST TEXAS BAPTIST

Senior Candy Vallo averaged 28.0 points in the two games last week. Vallo has scored 21 points in more in four straight games, and Saturday's 29-point game against Mississippi College was the fourth time this season she'd scored at least 28 points in a game.

TEXAS LUTHERAN

The Bulldogs dropped a three-point home game to UMHB and a two-point road overtime game at CTX... TLU had a 22-point lead in the first half against CTX but could not hold the lead... The Bulldogs scored a season-high 95 points in the OT loss at CTX.

LOUISIANA COLLEGE

With the win Thursday night over ETBU, LC clinched their second straight ASC Tournament berth. The Lady Wildcats fell to nationally-ranked Mississippi College on the road Tuesday night.

ASC Student-Athlete Advisory Committees Team Together to Raise Record \$8,761.14 For Charity

RICHARDSON, Texas — Student-Athlete Advisory Committees from the 15 American Southwest Conference campuses combined to raise a record \$8,761.14 for local community organizations in the third annual "Make a Change in 14 Days" loose coin collection project. Fifteen different organizations received support through the local campus fundraising efforts held from January 26-February 7.

"The student-athletes of the American Southwest Conference continue to display a willingness and enthusiastic spirit to be involved in supporting organizations within their communities," ASC Commissioner Amy Carlton said.

In the three years of the conference-wide community service campaign, nearly \$20,000 has been raised to benefit 31 different charitable organizations in ASC campus communities. The 2009 total bettered last year's record by \$622.26.

"I am impressed by this year's record-setting level of support for the conference-wide community service project," added Carlton.

The two-week SAAC event is also designed as a challenge among the ASC member campuses and is scheduled during the turn of the conference Division basketball schedule. Louisiana College, University of the Ozarks, Mississippi College and University of Texas at Dallas claimed the 2009 division pool title with a combined collection of \$3,674.09.



Louisiana College, located in Pineville, La., was the top-collecting ASC institution for the second straight year, raising \$2,211.08. LC again will split its funds raised between two local breast cancer treatment facilities, Cabrini Cancer Center and Rapides Regional Life Center. The two organizations were selected by the Louisiana College SAAC by recommendation of Lady Wildcats women's basketball coach Janice Joseph-Richard, who is undergoing treatment for a recurrence of breast cancer. The coach learned of the return of her cancer a week before the Make a Change in 14 Days campaign began.

"That really jump-started it," said Louisiana College SAAC President McCaslin Carson, a senior All-American softball player. "We did what we could for (Coach Joseph-Richard). So many people helped out – it wasn't just the SAAC."

LC collected the bulk of its funds at H.O. West Fieldhouse on January 29 and 31 as the Wildcats took on Texas-Dallas and Ozarks, respectively, in conference basketball action. In two years, Carson and SAAC Advisor Donnie Broussard have guided the collection of \$5,534.89, all directed toward breast cancer research.

"It has all been for a really good cause," Carson said.

The student-athlete advisory committees at McMurry University and Ozarks each raised more than \$1,000, while Schreiner University, Concordia University Texas, Texas Lutheran, University of Texas at Tyler, Sul Ross State University and East Texas Baptist University also posted their best "Make a Change in 14 Days" total in the three-year campaign. UT Tyler made its donation to Relay for Life in honor of Joseph-Richard.
