## Texas-Dallas to Host ASC Championship Tournament

RICHARDSON, Texas -- The University of Texas at Dallas posted a league mark of 16-4 to win the American Southwest Conference East Division title and the right to host the 2009 ASC Men's Basketball Championship Tournament at UTD Activity Center in Richardson, Texas, beginning Friday and lasting through Sunday (February 27-March 1).

The entire eight-team, single elimination event will be available for fans through free live video streaming with audio provided by the University of Texas at Dallas on the official tournament website, [http://cometsports.utdallas.edu/sports/2009/2/26/MBB\\_0226090447.aspx](http://cometsports.utdallas.edu/sports/2009/2/26/MBB_0226090447.aspx), and the conference's Tournament Central page on [www.ASCsports.org](http://www.ASCsports.org). Live statistics will also be available.



Head coach Terry Butterfield and UTD (21-4), winners of the 2005 ASC crown, will be making its sixth straight appearance to the conference tournament. This is the Comets' first time to host. UTD, which is the only league squad currently receiving votes in the d3Hoops.com national poll, will begin quarterfinal action at 7:30 p.m. on Friday against West Division No. 4 seed Sul Ross State University (8-16). The 2004 ASC champion Lobos return to the tournament after a two-year absence.

Reese, who takes the division's top weekly award for the third time this season, committed just three turnovers and dished out two assists.

Hardin-Simmons senior forward **Terrance Willis** (*Wichita Falls, TX / WFHS*) averaged 18 points, 8.5 rebounds, 4.5 assists and two steals to guide the Cowboys to a 2-0 week in conference play. Willis, who also added two blocked shots, had 18 points and 13 rebounds to close out his collegiate career against Texas Lutheran.

**LOUISIANA COLLEGE**

LC senior Josh Johnson finished his stellar career ranking fourteenth on the all-time scoring list in the history of LC men's basketball. LC honored all three of their seniors: Johnson, Dustin Cole, and Curt Bertrand, with a ceremony before their final game, Thursday at home against UT-Tyler

**MARY HARDIN-BAYLOR**

The Cru will enter the ASC Tournament with a nine-game winning streak and the UMHB men have won 18 of their last 22 after starting the season 0-3. Greg Wiernas had 14 points on 5-7 shooting in the victory over Sul Ross State. David Ray came up big with one of his best games of the season, posting 17 points and 14 rebounds in the win over Howard Payne. The UMHB men are in the ASC Tournament for the sixth straight year and have qualified for the tournament 10 times in Ken DeWeese's 11 seasons in Belton. The Cru men went 8-0 against the ASC West Division tournament teams but were 0-4 against the East Division representatives.

**EAST TEXAS BAPTIST**

Jeremiah Pojah closed out his ETBU career with a strong couple of games against Texas-Dallas and Ozarks. With ETBU clinging to postseason hopes, the big senior forward scored 12 points and pulled down 8 boards in a must-win against league leader UT Dallas on Thursday. He followed that with 15 points, 6 rebounds and a season-high 4 blocks in Saturday's win against Ozarks.

**MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE**

The Choctaws head into the ASC Tournament as the #2 seed in the ASC East. For only the third time in the last 12 seasons, MC will not enter the tournament as the top seed. The Choctaws have won five of their last six heading into the tournament, including winning four in a row on the road with a win at UT-Dallas, the host site of the tourney. Bryan Johnson is leading the ASC with a .655 shooting percentage and is second in the league, scoring 19.2 ppg.

**HARDIN-SIMMONS**

HSU set a school record conference record by making 21 3-pointers in the win at Schreiner. They also set both records for 3-point attempts with 66. HSU closed the season with two road wins, it was the first two road wins of the year. Rian Stubbs had a career-best 16 points and a career-best 14 rebounds in the win over Schreiner. He had 13 rebounds in the win over Texas Lutheran.

**HOWARD PAYNE**

The Jackets finished out their season with a win over Concordia and a loss to Mary Hardin-Baylor. Bryan Blalock averaged 15 points and 8 rebounds over two games this week. In the Jackets win over Concordia, Bryan came off the bench and score 19 points and grabbed 10 rebounds. On Saturday versus Mary Hardin-Baylor he had 15 points, 8 rebounds, and 5 assists.

**TEXAS-DALLAS**

Texas-Dallas clinched its first-ever outright East Division title by winning a "must-win" road game at LeTourneau in the season finale Saturday. After allowing ETBU to shoot over 50 percent in a Thursday loss, the Comets again clamped down defensively against LETU and held the Yellowjackets to just 42 percent shooting, including a 9-for-26 second half. UTD has wins against all four West Division teams coming to the ASC Tournament, and has just one loss in games against the East Division participants.

**SCHREINER**

The Mountaineers finished the last week of the season with a valiant effort. They fell short in both games, but it was not for lack of effort. David Flannery enjoyed a stellar week with 31 points, and 12 rebounds. Mitchell Lawrence stepped it up against McMurry and recorded 14 points and 5 rebounds; Trevor Connor recorded 23 points and 10 rebounds; and Riley Battle was tough as always, as he recorded 29 points, and 6 rebounds. The Mountaineers showed a lot of potential for seasons to come.

**MCMURRY**

McMurry won its first outright ASC West title since 2001-02 and and its seventh West Division title overall.

Head coach Ron Holmes and two-time ASC champion McMurry University (18-7, 17-4 ASC) enter as the West Division champion, a crown it has claimed seven different times. McMurry, which has qualified for nine of the 11 all-time ASC basketball tournaments, is in the first quarterfinal on Friday when it tips off at noon against East Division No. 4 seed University of Texas at Tyler (12-13). The Patriots have qualified for two straight ASC tourneys since becoming eligible for postseason play after serving for four years as an NCAA provisional member.

Mississippi College (18-6), which has won a men's basketball-record five ASC titles and is the only team to have qualified for every conference tournament, enters at the East Division's No. 2 seed and will open play at 2:30 p.m. on Friday against the West's No. 3 seed, Concordia University Texas. CTX reached the title game last season and is making its third straight appearance.

Defending ASC champion University of Mary Hardin-Baylor (18-7), which also enters on a league-best nine-game winning streak, will serve as the West's No. 2 seed. The Cru will battle East Division No. 3 seed LeTourneau University (16-9) at 5 p.m. on Friday. The YellowJackets return after missing the 2008 tourney.

The semifinals are scheduled to tip-off Saturday at 1 p.m. (McM-UT TYLER winner vs. MC-CTX winner) and 3:30 p.m. (UMHB-LETU winner vs. UTD-SRSU winner), with the championship game coming Sunday at 1:30 p.m.

The ASC championship tournament winner earns an automatic berth in the NCAA Division III Men's Basketball Championship.

## *ASC SAACs Raise Record \$8,761.14 For Charity*

RICHARDSON, Texas — Student-Athlete Advisory Committees from the 15 American Southwest Conference campuses combined to raise a record \$8,761.14 for local community organizations in the third annual "Make a Change in 14 Days" loose coin collection project. Fifteen different organizations received support through the local campus fundraising efforts held from January 26-February 7.

"The student-athletes of the American Southwest Conference continue to display a willingness and enthusiastic spirit to be involved in supporting organizations within their communities," ASC Commissioner Amy Carlton said.

In the three years of the conference-wide community service campaign, nearly \$20,000 has been raised to benefit 31 different charitable organizations in ASC campus communities. The 2009 total bettered last year's record by \$622.26.

"I am impressed by this year's record-setting level of support for the conference-wide community service project," added Carlton.

The two-week SAAC event is also designed as a challenge among the ASC member campuses and is the conference Division basketball schedule. Louisiana College, University of the Ozarks, Mississippi College and University of Texas at Dallas claimed the 2009 division pool title with a combined collection of \$3,674.09.

Louisiana College, located in Pineville, La., was the top-collecting ASC institution for the second straight year, raising \$2,211.08. LC again will split its funds raised between two local breast cancer treatment facilities, Cabrini Cancer Center and Rapides Regional Life Center. The two organizations were selected by the Louisiana College SAAC by recommendation of Lady Wildcats women's basketball coach Janice Joseph-Richard, who is undergoing treatment for a reoccurrence of breast cancer. The coach learned of the return of her cancer a week before the Make a Change in 14 Days campaign began.

"That really jump-started it," said Louisiana College SAAC President McCaslin Carson, a senior All-American softball player. "We did what we could for (Coach Joseph-Richard). So many people helped out – it wasn't just the SAAC. "

LC collected the bulk of its funds at H.O. West Fieldhouse on January 29 and 31 as the Wildcats took on Texas-Dallas and Ozarks, respectively, in conference basketball action. In two years, Carson and SAAC Advisor Donnie Broussard have guided the collection of \$5,534.89, all directed toward breast cancer research.

"It has all been for a really good cause," Carson said.

The student-athlete advisory committees at McMurry University and Ozarks each raised more than \$1,000, while Schreiner University, Concordia University Texas, Texas Lutheran, University of Texas at Tyler, Sul Ross State University and East Texas Baptist University also posted their best "Make a Change in 14 Days" total in the three-year campaign. UT Tyler made its donation to Relay for Life in honor of Joseph-Richard.

#### TEXAS-TYLER

The UT Tyler men's team went 2-0 on the week and secured the final spot in this week's ASC tournament. The week also included the program's first-ever win over Mississippi College. This week the Patriots, the 4-seed from the East, will take on McMurry, the 1-seed from the West, at UT Dallas.

#### OZARKS

Forward Chris Williams ended the season as the team's leading scorer (15.5) and rebounder (8.6). He led the ASC in rebounding and three-point percentage (48%). Williams finished the year with 10 double-doubles and ends his career with over 600 career points and over 400 career rebounds. Guard Jeremy Clark had a break-out season for Ozarks, averaging 15.1 points per game. Guard Tony Brock moved into ninth place on Ozarks All-Time leaders in assists (253).

#### TEXAS LUTHERAN

TLU won three more games than last season and three more games than the previous year's conference mark...TLU Head Coach Tommy Jones finished his second year with the team...The Bulldogs finished the year with three players averaging in double figures in scoring. Sophomore Jonathan Hutton, senior Nate Walton and sophomore Brad Howard each averaged more than 10.3 ppg. Hutton averaged 11.0...First-year forward Isaac Williams made his first collegiate start on Saturday. He averaged 9.5 points and 4.4 rebounds in 08-09...Seniors Nate Walton and Josh Scott played their final games as Bulldogs...Walton finished as the 21st all-time leading scorer in school history, with 1,195 career points. He had 20 points in his final collegiate contest.
