## McMurry to Host ASC Championship Tournament

*Free Live Video Streaming with Audio, Live Statistics for All Games!!*

RICHARDSON, Texas -- McMurry University posted a league mark of 17-4 to win the American Southwest Conference West Division title and the right to host the 2009 ASC Women's Basketball Championship Tournament at Kimbrell Arena in Abilene, Texas, beginning Friday and lasting through Sunday (February 27-March 1).

The entire eight-team, single elimination event will be available for fans through free live video streaming with audio provided by McMurry University on the official tournament website, <http://athletics.mcm.edu/News/gen/2009/2/25/ascwbct.asp>, and the conference's *Tournament Central* page on [www.ASCsports.org](http://www.ASCsports.org). Live statistics will also be available.

Head coach Veronica Snow and McMurry (20-5), which won the 2006 ASC title and has now won three West Division crowns overall, will begin tournament play at 8 p.m. on Friday against East Division No. 4 seed University of Texas at Tyler (15-10). McMurry has been the ASC runner-up five times, including the last two years, and has made five consecutive trips to the conference tourney. This is its first time to host. The Patriots have qualified for two straight ASC tourneys since becoming eligible for postseason play after serving for four years as an NCAA provisional member.

## PLAYERS OF THE WEEK

### CO-EAST DIVISION

#### **Rosemary Green, F, Sr., Mississippi College**

Mississippi College senior forward **Rosemary Green** (*Mize, MS/Jones County JC*) averaged 16 points, 5.5 rebounds and 2.5 assists to help guide the Lady Choctaws to a pair of wins over fellow ASC tournament teams Louisiana College and Texas-Tyler. Green, who committed just three turnovers, added two steals on the week and shot 56.5 percent from the floor.

#### **Candy Vallo, G, Sr., East Texas Baptist**

East Texas Baptist senior guard **Candy Vallo** (*Shreveport, LA/Loyola College Prep*) averaged 26 points and three steals over two wins to close out the season, including a six-point victory over nationally-ranked and East Division champion Texas-Dallas. Vallo, who takes the division's top weekly award for the second time this season, added six rebounds and four assists.

### WEST DIVISION

#### **Amber Horton, G, Sr., McMurry**

McMurry senior guard **Amber Horton** (*Mansfield, TX/Mansfield Summitt HS*) averaged 18 points, 4.5 steals, 3.5 rebounds and 3.5 assists to guide a pair of road victories that clinched the West Division title and the right to host the ASC Championship Tournament. Horton, who takes the division's weekly award for the second time this season, committed just three turnovers and shot 63 percent from the floor. She also went 10-for-12 from the free throw line.

### OZARKS

Freshman guard Lacey Phillips ended the season as the Lady Eagles top scorer (10.5). Phillips was also the team leader in three-pointers (35). Olivia Fisher ends her collegiate career as the fourth leading rebounder (817) in school history. Fisher, who earned All-Conference in three different sports, also surpassed the 1,000 career point barrier.

### TEXAS-TYLER

The UT Tyler women went 0-2 on the week with tough road losses at Louisiana and at Mississippi. However, junior Becky Taylor, along with HSU's Lindsey Newcombe, broke the ASC single-season rebound record. This week the Patriots will play in the ASC Championship tournament. UT Tyler, the 4-seed from the East, will play host McMurry, the 1-seed from the West.

### TEXAS-DALLAS

UTD set team records this season with 21 wins and earned its first-ever ASC East Division title. The Comets went into a bit of a shooting slump during their last two road games, dropping a close game at ETBU, then pulling away late to defeat LETU and win the division title.

The Mountaineers finished a tough season with 2 losses. Despite the tough season, the team never gave up and worked very hard. Monica Enriquez finished the week (and her career at SU) like the superstar she has been her entire career. This week she put up 32 points, 5 rebounds, 6 assists, 1 block and 5 steals. Xandria White had a good week as well, putting up 25 points and 16 rebounds. Hannah Burleson added with her 23 points.

**HARDIN-SIMMONS**

HSU has won 20 games for the 11th straight season. It is the fourth longest streak in the nation. Lindsey Newcombe has set the new ASC record for rebounds in a season with 333. She and Becky Taylor of UTT are neck-and-neck for the league rebounding title and both have broken the previous rebounding record. HSU hit 37 3-pointers in two games last week. The Cowgirls, along with Mississippi College, are the only teams to qualify for every American Southwest Conference Tournament. HSU has won six ASC Tournament titles, but are looking for their first since the 2003 season.

**HOWARD PAYNE**

The Lady Jackets secured their 6th consecutive 20 win season with wins over Concordia and Mary Hardin-Baylor this week. Hope Hohertz averaged a double-double in wins over Concordia and Mary Hardin-Baylor. Hohertz received a full court pass from Sarah Jockers and hit an off balance layup as time expired to defeat Concordia 55-53. Howard Payne continues to be one of the defensive leaders in the ASC holding their to just 34% shooting from the field.

**EAST TEXAS BAPTIST**

Junior F Satara Harrell missed averaging a double-double on the season by eight rebounds, finishing with averages of 15.3 points and 9.7 rebounds in her first season at ETBU.

**MISSISSIPPI COLLEGE**

The Lady Choctaws will enter the ASC Tournament in Abilene as the #2 seed in the ASC East. MC has won four in a row heading into the tournament in Abilene. The Lady Choctaws are looking for their first ever bid into the NCAA Tournament.

**TEXAS LUTHERAN**

The Bulldogs concluded their season with seven more wins than in the previous year...TLU put together seven victories and five ASC wins after not recording an overall or conference win last year...The Bulldogs concluded the first year as head coach for Roxanne Long...Seven of the Bulldogs' top eight scorers this season were freshmen...First-year post Tamisha Timpson led the Bulldogs in scoring (10.8) and was second in rebounds (7.0)...TLU sophomore post Courtney Haskell tied the single-season school record for blocks, with 49. She now has 93 career blocks. The TLU career mark is 102.

**LOUISIANA COLLEGE**

LC earned its second consecutive berth in the ASC Tournament...LC's lone senior, Krystle Hunter, finished her regular season career with 17 points in a win over Tyler.

**MARY HARDIN-BAYLOR**

The Cru women will advance to the ASC Tournament for the fourth straight year. UMHB has been the #4 seed in those last three trips but has advanced to the second round twice and to the championship game once in that span. Kallie White had 12 points and seven rebounds to keep the Cru in the game against Howard Payne on Saturday. Stacie Urbina also came off the bench to add 10 points in that game. The UMHB women are 3-7 against the rest of the teams in this year's ASC Tournament field.

Head coach Polly Thomason and the University of Texas at Dallas (21-4, 18-2 ASC) enter as the East Division champion, a crown it claimed for the first time in program history. The Comets are making their third straight appearance in the ASC tournament after not ever qualifying before that. UTD, which is receiving votes in both major women's basketball national polls, has the first quarterfinal on Friday when it tips off at 12:30 p.m. against the West Division's No. 4 seed, University of Mary Hardin-Baylor (13-12). The Lady Cru reached the title game in 2001 and 2006 and will be appearing in its fourth straight postseason.

Six-time ASC champion Hardin-Simmons University (20-5) enters as the West's No. 2 seed and will open play at 3 p.m. on Friday against the East's No. 3 seed, Louisiana College (16-8). HSU won the conference crown from 1999 through 2004 and is the only league team to have qualified for all 11 ASC women's basketball tournaments. LC is making its second straight appearance.

Mississippi College (22-3), which will be appearing in its tenth ASC tournament, is the East's Division's No. 2 seed and at 5:30 p.m. on Friday will take on defending NCAA Division III national champion Howard Payne University (20-5), the West's No. 3 seed. MC is the only league squad currently nationally ranked. HPU, which went 33-0 last season and became the first NCAA team national champion in any sport in the ASC's history, has won two straight conference titles and three of the last four.

The semifinals are scheduled to tip off Saturday at 1:30 p.m. (UTD-UMHB winner vs. HSU-LC winner) and 4 p.m. (MC-HPU winner vs. McM-UT TYLER winner), with the championship game coming Sunday at 2 p.m.

The ASC championship tournament winner earns an automatic berth in the NCAA Division III Women's Basketball Championship.

## *ASC Student-Athlete Advisory Committees Team Together to Raise Record \$8,761.14 For Charity*

RICHARDSON, Texas — Student-Athlete Advisory Committees from the 15 American Southwest Conference campuses combined to raise a record \$8,761.14 for local community organizations in the third annual "Make a Change in 14 Days" loose coin collection project. Fifteen different organizations received support through the local campus fundraising efforts held from January 26-February 7.

"The student-athletes of the American Southwest Conference continue to display a willingness and enthusiastic spirit to be involved in supporting organizations within their communities," ASC Commissioner Amy Carlton said.

In the three years of the conference-wide community service campaign, nearly \$20,000 has been raised to benefit 31 different charitable organizations in ASC campus communities. The 2009 total bettered last year's record by \$622.26.

"I am impressed by this year's record-setting level of support for the conference-wide community service project," added Carlton.

The two-week SAAC event is also designed as a challenge among the ASC member campuses and is scheduled during the turn of the conference Division basketball schedule. Louisiana College, University of the Ozarks, Mississippi College and University of Texas at Dallas claimed the 2009 division pool title with a combined collection of \$3,674.09.

Louisiana College, located in Pineville, La., was the top-collecting ASC institution for the second straight year, raising \$2,211.08. LC again will split its funds raised between two local breast cancer treatment facilities, Cabrini Cancer Center and Rapides Regional Life Center. The two organizations were selected by the Louisiana College SAAC by recommendation of Lady Wildcats women's basketball coach Janice Joseph-Richard, who is undergoing treatment for a recurrence of breast cancer. The coach learned of the return of her cancer a week before the Make a Change in 14 Days campaign began.

"That really jump-started it," said Louisiana College SAAC President McCaslin Carson, a senior All-American softball player. "We did what we could for (Coach Joseph-Richard). So many people helped out – it wasn't just the SAAC."

LC collected the bulk of its funds at H.O. West Fieldhouse on January 29 and 31 as the Wildcats took on Texas-Dallas and Ozarks, respectively, in conference basketball action. In two years, Carson and SAAC Advisor Donnie Broussard have guided the collection of \$5,534.89, all directed toward breast cancer research.

"It has all been for a really good cause," Carson said.

The student-athlete advisory committees at McMurry University and Ozarks each raised more than \$1,000, while Schreiner University, Concordia University Texas, Texas Lutheran, University of Texas at Tyler, Sul Ross State University and East Texas Baptist University also posted their best "Make a Change in 14 Days" total in the three-year campaign. UT Tyler made its donation to Relay for Life in honor of Joseph-Richard.
